The Karuk Tribe requests qualifications for the following Scope of Work required for **Boys Council Facilitator** for the Yreka Karuk Housing native girls that are going into fourth through eighth grades. Interested individuals would need to be available to begin work February 2020. Will be paid \$20.00 per hour for 2 hours per session for 12 week. **We have two positions available.**

Task One

Organize and conduct a Boys Council (Living A Legacy: A Rite of Passage) **weekly on selected weekday from 4pm-6pm.** Facilitate Boys Council and Oversee activities within the Boys Council Manual.

- A. Organize materials/supplies required prior to each session.
- B. Ensure group includes the target population of at least 5 participants, with a max of 10.
- C. Promote an emotional safe setting and structure within which the target population can develop caring relationships and use authentic voices.
- D. We may implement group with basketball skill building so coaching background is a plus.

Responses to this Request for Proposals should include the following:

- 1) A statement of qualifications, including relevant project history.
- 2) A proposed approach and rationale for completion of the contract tasks described above, including descriptions of similar work previously completed and the results/benefits achieved.
