Old Business:

Director Reports:

1) Ray Elliot:

The Council is interested in exploring the possibility of opening a women's transitional house. The property on Comstock has been identified as a potentially suitable location due to its two-story layout and multiple rooms, which could accommodate several individuals. Amy noted that housing 6–7 women together may present unique challenges, as tensions can sometimes escalate more quickly among women than men. Additionally, specific policies would need to be developed to address the fact that many women may have children with them. One proposed solution is to have a house manager reside on-site to help oversee daily operations and ensure rules are followed.

3) Merris Obie:

The Programs Coordinator has been appointed and has begun her work by focusing on opening foster homes in the three service areas. The Technology Coordinator position is still being advertised and remains open until filled, with hopes of securing a qualified candidate soon.

A new service is now available for tribal children that utilizes neurotechnology to help reverse the effects of trauma. This method is supported by scientific research. Merris may consider sending a staff member to receive the training and return to share the knowledge with the rest of the team. Resolution 25-R-108 will allow the Tribe to become a Title IV-E agency, which would increase access to funding and support the development of additional programs to better serve our children.

5) Dr. Lew:

The 3-day Dentrix training in Yreka went well. Staff are still working on understanding the scanners, as some user errors are occurring while they learn how the system operates. Budget allocations are currently 30% for Happy Camp, 37% for Yreka, and 26% for Orleans.

An orthodontist will soon begin offering services in Happy Camp. These services will be available exclusively to tribal members and descendants. A waitlist will be created, and patient selection will be based on medical need and a first-come, first-served process. Yreka will require a new clinic in order to accommodate additional patients, as the current facility lacks a sufficient number of chairs for treatment. While the Happy Camp clinic is well-equipped, the area does not have enough housing to support new staff being brought in.

7) Susanna Greeno:

This past month was shorter than usual, and the transition to the new systems has presented some challenges. Laura Mayton noted that the paperwork required for elders is very confusing and asked if there might be a way to better support them through the process. Susanna acknowledged that while assisting with this paperwork does take time away from regular duties, it's necessary to ensure that data is properly transferred into the new system.

Greg Goodwin's last day was May 30th, and since his departure, the clinic is no longer accepting new patients. Susanna would like to request a dedicated Facebook page for her department to share updates and notify the public about upcoming events. Additionally, IHS recently visited the clinic and informed Susanna of a potential funding opportunity of up to \$10 million.

Informational: A tribal employee is here to ask for assistance with going back to school to be a Physician's assistant she hopes to graduate by 2029 and has a total of \$10,000 dollars. The classes would not take her away from her work and would come back and work for the tribe.

<u>Informational</u>: An Orleans clinic intern has almost finished her school and would like to hire her on full time when she finishes. She has recently been certified to do SUD counseling and has recently finished her hours.

Informational: General discussion was held on the tribal consortium, and the Parcel B lands. It was also talked about making an advisory board allowing tribes with ancestral ties to the land in the parcel to have a seat including the Shasta Nation.

Informational: BOS Humboldt County: Eli recommends attending or contract Steve Madrone regarding the ICWA issues and to attend when the CDSS report will be provided. Eli should attend any BOS Humboldt County Meeting and attend when available.

<u>Informational</u>: Two trailers were identified to be used as workforce housing possibly 3. They can be sent down there and remain locked. Numbers 6, 86, and 51.

Informational: There was another break-in at the Yreka smoke shop, and this time several youth were caught. The Sheriff's Office has reached out to ask how the Tribe would like to proceed. The Sheriff is recommending that the youth issue a formal apology to the Tribe and complete community service hours. After discussing the matter, the Council agreed that requiring the youth to perform community service in the Yreka community garden would be an appropriate and constructive resolution.
